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President's Message

In a recent review on drug development I pointed out that although there are about 20,000 genes and 100,000 proteins in humans that are potential drug targets, only 324 of these targets have yet yielded approved drugs. Of these, only 266 were derived from the human genome, whereas the rest are microbial targets. Thus much of successful drug development is directed at antimicrobials, and to be honest, these are probably the agents that do the most good. One of the spectacular successes of antimicrobial drug development is HIV – an infection that was uniformly fatal a couple of decades ago, yet now most people with HIV can expect a fairly normal lifespan. And it looks like viral hepatitis is heading the same way.

So it is rather disturbing that I received [a letter from Tom Gottlieb](#) who is President of the Australasian Society for Infectious Diseases pointing out that there is a crisis looming for antimicrobials. In a letter to the members of ASCEPT he has written that “Antibiotics are the original miracle drugs. When use became widespread after the 1950s, it was in an era of great medical optimism, and society at large and the medical profession came to believe in antibiotic infallibility. Sixty years on, resistance to antibiotics is increasing dangerously worldwide. It has recently been listed by the WHO as one of the three greatest threats to human health.... In the past we have usually been saved by the regular introduction of new compounds but this time the antibiotic production pipeline is dry”. The crisis of antibiotics should be a priority for our Society and I am sure that there are many members who might have suggestions and ideas for how ASCEPT can contribute to improving this dire situation.
